Graduation Requirements

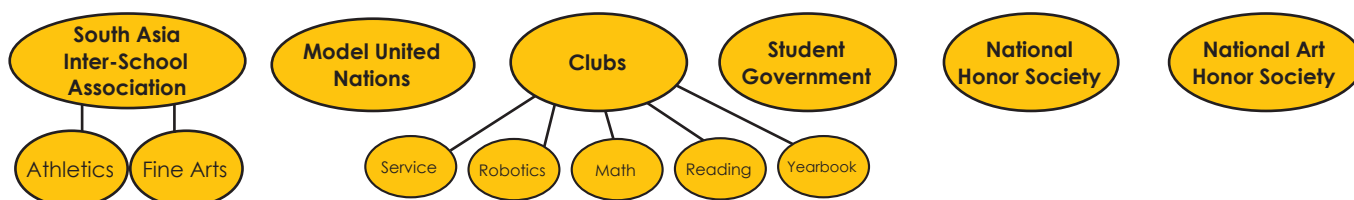

- LAS does not administer the ACT, students wishing to take the ACT must do so at a local test center offering the exam

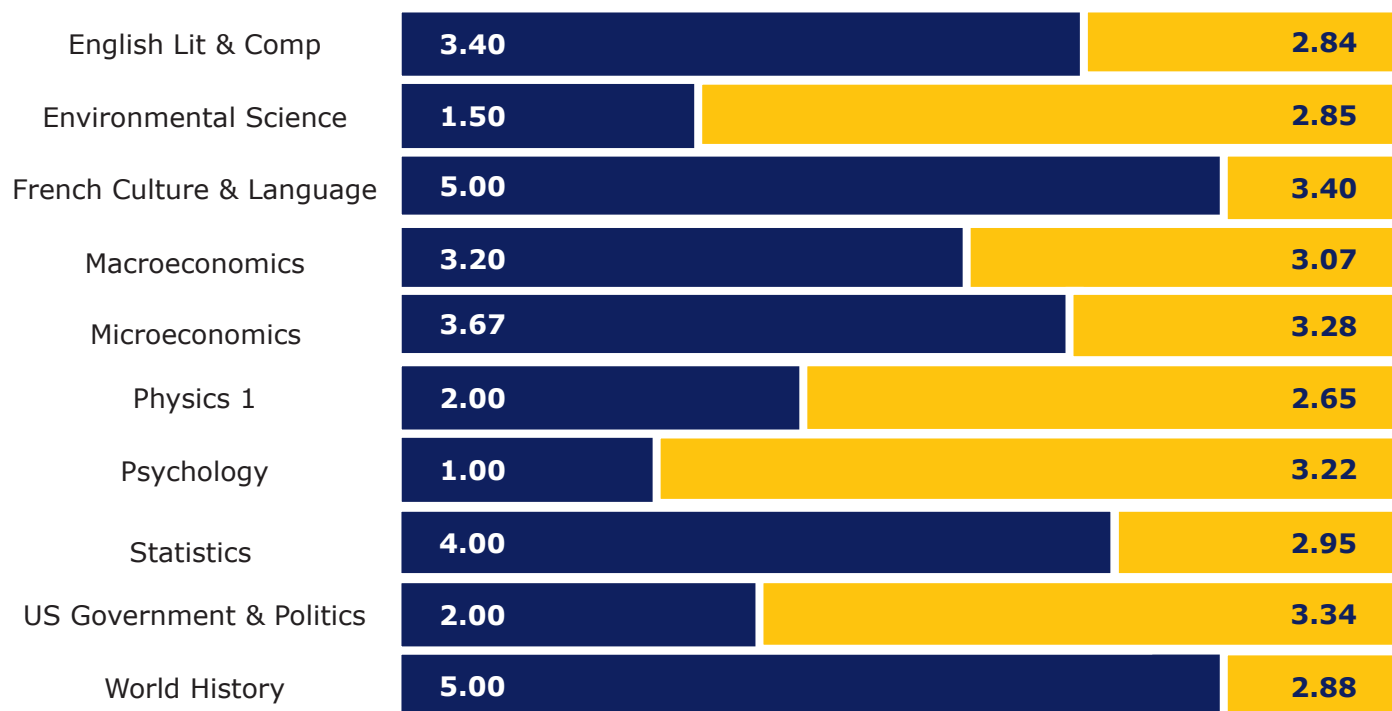

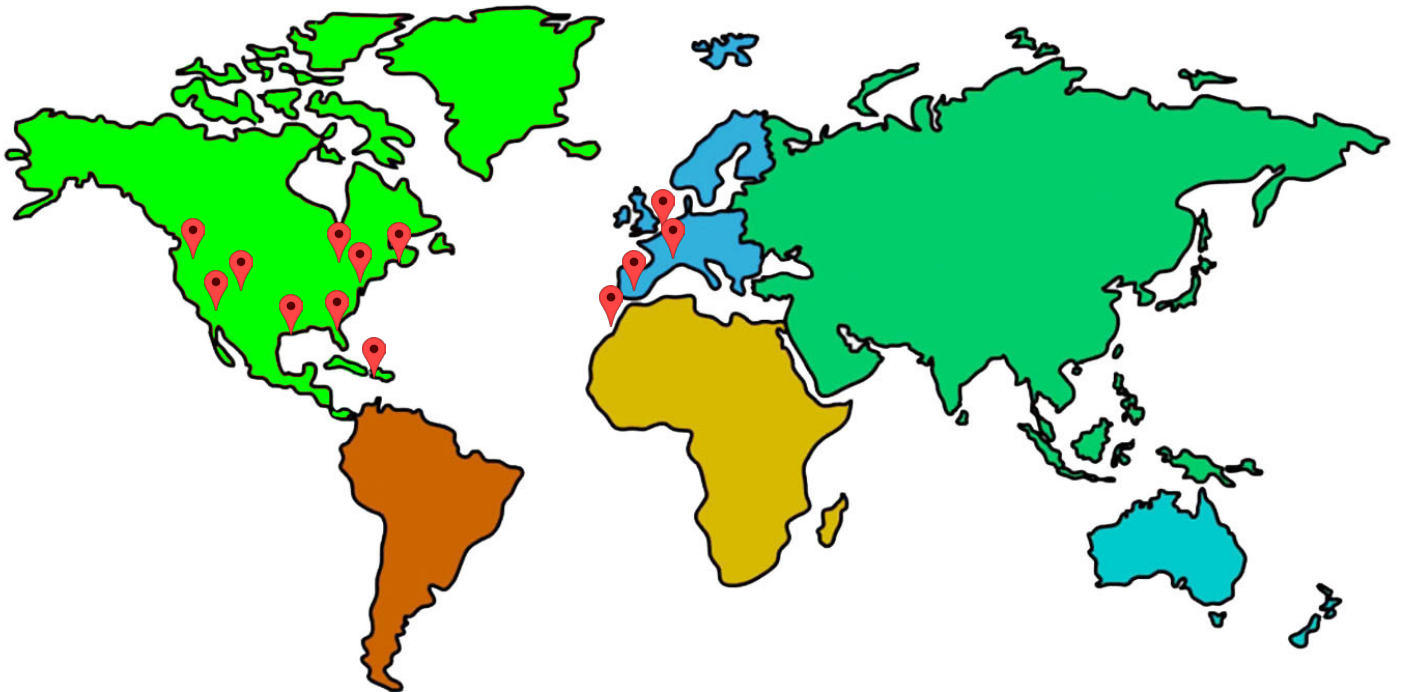
