Lahore American School (LAS) was founded in 1956 to serve families of the U.S. Embassy in their pursuit of an American-style education while serving in Pakistan. *Lahore American School* is an independent co-educational day school offering a U.S. based educational program from Preschool through Grade 12 for students (age range 3 years to 17) of all nationalities. *LAS* is one of the oldest and most prestigious schools in Pakistan.

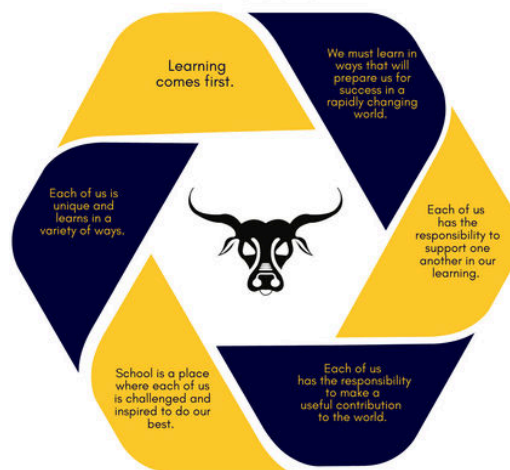

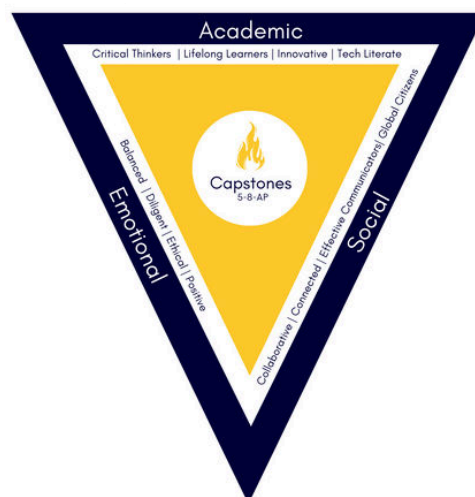
Mission

The Lahore American High School

Academic Program

Our approach to teaching and learning at Lahore American School is based on an Inquiry/Project-Based Learning (IPBL) model, which is student-centered and bottom-up in its approach, emphasizing discovery, project/experiential learning, and collaboration. In support of this, LAS adopted a definition of High-Quality Teaching and Learning (HQTl): “High-quality teaching and learning at LAS is collaborative, student-centered, differentiated, and informed by assessment. Students are empowered and inspired to reach their full potentials as engaged learners and are celebrated for their achievements. Teachers seek to build authentic connections between students, families, and local communities and to create an environment of inclusion.”

LAS Community Service Program

Lahore American School’s Community Service Program is an innovative program that cultivates holistic development. It allows students the unique opportunity to give back to their local community, while concurrently exploring their career passions. By engaging in hands-on service that resonates with their interests, students not only contribute meaningfully to the larger community, but they also gain invaluable insights into their chosen fields. Eighty (80) community service hours are required in the high school.
