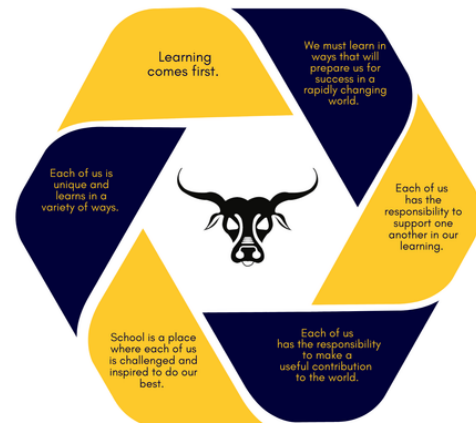

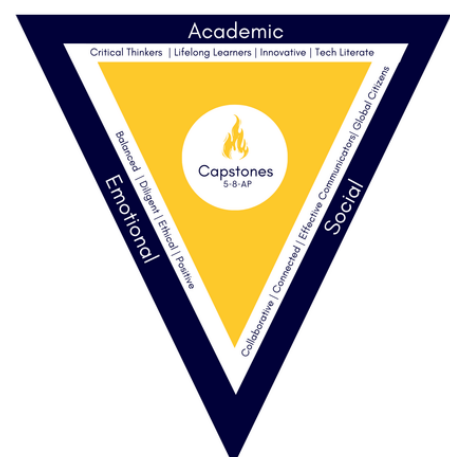
Mission

The Lahore American High School

Lahore American School (LAS) is an American college preparatory international school located in Lahore, Pakistan. Advanced Placement courses are our highest level of academic courses that we present to our students. Our students are academically motivated and are all focusing on attending college or university upon graduation.

Academic Program

Our approach to teaching and learning at *Lahore American School* is based on an Inquiry/Project-Based Learning (IPBL) model, which is student-centered and bottom-up in its approach, emphasizing discovery, project/experiential learning, and collaboration.
